

Nikos Chatzinikolaou wrote small articles in the local newspaper "Voice of Nea Smyrni" while he was still in the last grade of high school.

He started his journalistic career in the mid-1980s, in the Mesimbrini newspaper as a student. Also, apart from Mesimbrini, he has collaborated with the newspapers Acropolis of Kyriaki, Ethnos and with the magazines ENA and Status.

He engaged in political reporting and at a young age won the award of the Botsi Foundation, for the success of the interview with Evangelos Averof. In the electronic media, he started broadcasting on the municipal radio station Athens 9.84.

From 1989 since 2003 he worked at the Mega Channel television station. He presented the main news bulleting and also the show Enopios Enopio.

In 2006 he was the chairman of the board and managing director of the television station Alpha TV, as well as of the radio station Alpha 98.9 before joining DEMCO and Dimitris Kontominas. Until the middle of January 2007, he presented the main news bulletin of Alpha TV together with the journalist Mara Zachareas. He had also taken over two more informative broadcasts of the station, Antignomia and Prosopa. The Antignomies contained analyzes of current news, mainly political, while the "Faces" dealt with interviews of famous and well-known people.

In 2007 Mr. Hatzinikolaou founded the radio stations Real FM 97.8 in Athens and Real FM 107.1 in Thessaloniki and the Sunday weekly newspaper Real News. In February 2012, he created the informative website enikos.gr. In addition, for the period 2019-2021, he presents the show Enopios Enopio, which returned to the screens after 16 years of absence and through the frequency of ANT1.
